From the time she was a child, Terri lit up the room with her vibrant radiance and personality and truly never met a stranger. Terri lived in Charlotte, Winston-Salem, Greensboro and Troutman, before settling in Mooresville in 1998, where she resided until her death. Terri was an entrepreneur who owned several businesses and traveled the USA in her career as a flight attendant with Piedmont Airlines and then U.S. Air. She retired from U.S. Air in 2000 and relished her retirement, spending the days with her husband, Steve, helping him in the family owned business and they enjoyed the lake life, spending time with family and friends, and being actively involved at their church. Terri was an amazing cook with a gift for organization, which she put to use caring for family, friends, neighbors and her church family. Terri volunteered at the Hope House of Huntersville for a couple of years.

Terri married the love of her life, Charles S (Steve) Ebert in 1996. Together, they built their dream home on Barber Loop on Lake Norman. They were an inseparable pair who genuinely enjoyed each other's company. Their love for each other was evident to all who spent time with them, and they each said the other made them feel like the most important person in the world. They were often able to communicate with each other without saying a word.

In addition to maintaining her beautiful yard and flower gardens, Terri enjoyed being a part of the Queen City Corvette Club (where she and Steve took car trips in their Corvette Convertible, the Red Hat Society Club (Terri could rock a hat like few others), spending time with the "O Girls" from Olympic High School in Charlotte, and traveling with Steve to Cabo San Lucas, Mexico and exploring Italy, Greece and Turkey on a Mediterranean cruise.
