May 30, 1926 - April 24, 2020

Arthur Mund Rogers, 93, of Mooresville, died April 24, 2020 at the Novant Presbyterian Medical Center in Charlotte, NC, after a battle with the Coronavirus.

He was born May 30, 1926 in Jamaica, New York, to Elmer and Caroline Rogers. Arthur was married to Katherine Rogers, who preceded him in death. Also preceding his death is his son, Richard.

Surviving are 2 sons, Ronald of East Greenbush, NY; Russell of Mooresville, NC and daughter, Kathleen of Durham, NC; 2 daughters-in-law, Lisa (Ron) and Brenda (Russell); 5 grandchildren, Wendy, Kevin, David, Mark and Alex; and 6 great grandchildren.

Arthur called Mooresville home for the past 11 years. He moved to Mooresville from Fuquay-Varina, NC, after his wife of 59 years passed away.

Arthur was well known throughout Mooresville. Unofficially known as the “Ambassador of Richard’s Coffee Shop”, Arthur, was a friend to many. He could always be found at the Welcome Home Veterans Coffee Shop. He participated in civic activities, loved to give inspirational talks to schools, churches and social gatherings, and he thoroughly enjoyed being with people. The veteran coffee shop was his ministry, he loved to fellowship with veterans.

Art was a craftsman, especially with wood, and one of his favorite past times was carving walking sticks and canes to help folks, especially veterans, walk their way through life.

Arthur was a blessed man. He served his country in the Navy during WW II, and in 2019, was inducted into the NC Veterans Hall of Fame, for his contribution in the development of the atomic bomb.

Funeral services will be held at 11 AM, Monday, October 5, 2020, at the Cavin-Cook Funeral Home Chapel, Mooresville. A graveside service will follow at 1 PM at Salisbury National Cemetery.

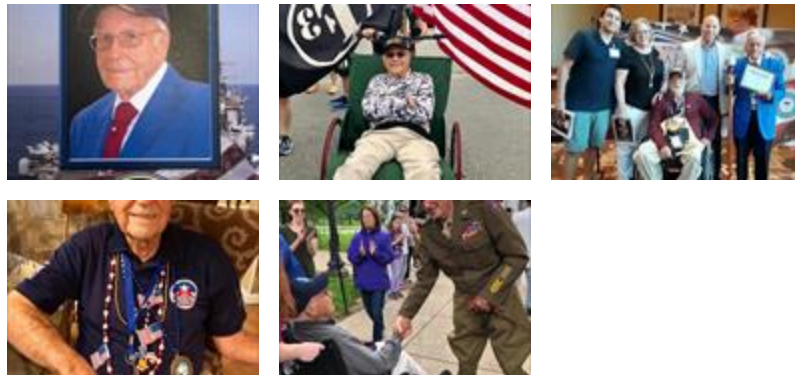
