Barbara Fitzgerald Taylor passed away on March 29, 2014 in Davidson, NC at the age of 87. She was born in Washington, DC on April 3, 1926. She lived for forty years in Westfield, NJ and was a member of the Presbyterian Church retiring in 1985 to Florida.

Barbara was preceded in death by her husband Robert H. Taylor in 2012 and her two sisters: Shirley Ann Herman and Harolyn Schweitzer. She is survived by her 3 daughters: Carolyn and John Groves of Avondale, PA, Cynthia and Al Segovia of San Antonio and Constance Mero of Mooresville, NC, along with 8 grandchildren: Ty, Brett, Daniel, Orion, Sarah, Carolyn, Melissa and Gregory, 6 great grandchildren and 4 nieces and nephews.

Barbara graduated from Bucknell University in 1947 and was a member of Alpha Chi Omega. She was a Registrar of Records at Kean University in New Jersey and served as Chairperson of the Wilkens Lecture Committee.

As a lifelong volunteer, her various contributions included Girl Scouts, Hospice in New Jersey and Florida, and the Westfield YMCA Synchronized Swim Team. She was also a founder of the Alpha Chi Omega chapter in Westfield. In Florida, she volunteered at the Smithsonian Marine Center and Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute where Barbara and Robert's extensive shell collection remains on display.
