We would buy either a moon pie, peanuts, crackers & either a Coke, Sundrop, or a Royal Crown cola. Then we would walk up the railroad tracks as far as we could, then we would cross over to the sidewalk. She got the nickname Sister from her brother Butch. Because he couldn't say Brenda, Butch called her Sister, but with T, instead of an S. It's no wonder we were so skinny back then. Walking from the mill hill to school was somewhere between (3-5) miles. We only rode Gabriel bus to school when the weather was bad. I worked with her at Draymore briefly. I hadn't seen her in years, but I never forgot about her or our childhood growing up together. I even knew her late husband, even though they had separated years ago.
