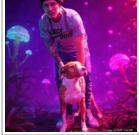

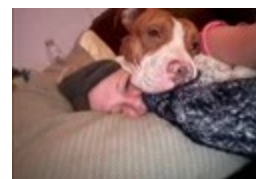
(Grief is not just an emotion—it's an unraveling, a space where something once lived but is now gone. It carves through you, leaving a hollow ache where love once resided.

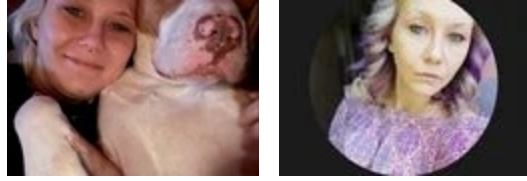

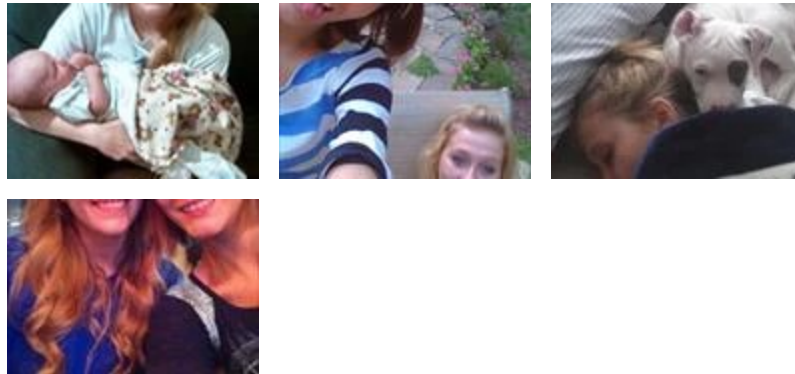
