Byron Edward Crowley, 82, of Mooresville, died peacefully at his home early Wednesday morning November 12, 2014.

He was born on April 10, 1932 in Orlando, FL, to the late Halburton and Lillian Vick Crowley. Mr. Crowley was a graduate of the University of the South, Sewanee, TN, where he was sports editor for the school newspaper and elected to Camp's All-American Swim team. He served in the US Army Signal Corps during the Korean War, stationed in Germany. He was employed by McKesson and Robbins for 13 years before returning to Charlotte to start his own business, Timely Service Distributors. Then upon his retirement in 1992 he returned to his first loves of photography and writing. For several years his travel articles were published in the Mooresville Tribune and Charlotte Observer.

Mr. Crowley is survived by his wife of 60 years, Shirley Cantwell Crowley; children, Sarah Deese of Mooresville, Glenn Crowley and wife, Sandy of Concord; brother, Richard Crowley of Kings Mountain; grandsons, AJ Crowley of Stanley and Noah Fleming of Mooresville; and several nieces and

nephews.

A memorial service will be held at 2:00 PM on Saturday, November 22 at First Presbyterian Church with Rev. David Rockness officiating. The family will receive friends following the service at the church.
