Chester Sackowski, 88, of Mooresville, formerly of Bethpage, Long Island, NY, passed away on Wednesday, March 11, 2015 at the Gordon Hospice House in Statesville.

He was born on April 20, 1926 in Little Neck, NY, to the late Joseph and Stephanie Sackowski. Mr. Sackowski was a WWII US Army veteran serving in the Philippines and Japan under General MacArthur. He loved to garden and was a master carpenter, working with designers. His works were published in magazines and newspapers in the N.Y. area. Mr. Sackowski enjoyed boating in the Long Island area and was an avid golfer, even caddying for Babe Ruth. He had a great sense of humor all the way to the end.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by brothers, Henry, Steve, Edward and Harry.
