Christ Freeman Winters, 85, of Mooresville died Wednesday December 24, 2014 after a brief illness. He was born July 14, 1929 in Detroit, Michigan to the late Christ Freeman Winters Sr. and Viola Schmeltz. He was a retired employee of Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company where he worked for 39 years. A United States Navy Veteran of the Korean War, Mr. Winters was very involved in his church and community. His activities included, a former President of St. Joseph's Men's Guild, a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, a Fourth Degree Knight of the Knights of Columbus, a former Commander of his American Legion post in Garden City, NY, a Board of Director for the Boy Scouts of America Nassau County Council, and a member of the VFW. Chris joined the United States Navy in 1951 and served on the U.S.S. Corregidor. After joining the Navy, Chris met Grace Ann Scalia in Brooklyn NY at a U.S.O dance. It was love at first sight and 9 months after meeting the two were wed, their marriage lasted 62 years. Years later after settling with their family in Garden City, NY they had daughter Karen Ann Kavanagh of Bohemia, NY, sons Keith Anthony Winters of Islip Terrace, NY, and Brian Joseph Winters who predeceased his father. Mr. Winters was a member of St. Therese Roman Catholic Church in Mooresville. In addition to

his wife and children, he is survived by eight grandchildren. A visitation will be held at Cavin-Cook Funeral Home, 494 East Plaza Dr., in Mooresville on Sunday December 28, 2014 from 2-4pm. A funeral mass will be held on Monday December 29, 2014 at St. Therese Roman Catholic Church, at 11am.
