June 21, 1943 - June 6, 2024

Clyde "Soupy" Frank Campbell, III, 80, of Kannapolis, NC, passed away on Thursday, June 6, 2024 in Charlottesville, VA.

He was born on June 21, 1943 in Alexandra, Louisiana, to Clyde Frank Campbell II and Willa Mae Campbell. Soupy was a proud Marine Corps Vietnam Veteran who served as a structural mechanic and helicopter gunner. He even worked on Marine One. After his service, Soupy attended and played football at Lees-McRae College and Mars Hill University, where he met his wife, Diane. Soupy had a long coaching career after college, coaching at Hoke County High School, Lees McRae College, and Northwest Cabarrus High School. Soupy was inducted into the Lees McRae Athletics Hall of Fame, where he played and coached. Soupy coached players who would later go into the NFL. However, Soupy was most proud of his work as a teacher, starting the AP History program at Northwest Cabarrus High School. He loved teaching and inspiring future teachers. Soupy touched so many lives both throughout his coaching and teaching career.

Soupy's greatest love was being Grandpa Soup. He loved playing with his grandkids and attending their school events. He never missed an opportunity to do either. He is survived by children, Christy Welch (John) and Russell Campbell (Sallie); and grandchildren, Madison and Cameron Welch, Maxton, Charlotte, and Boone Campbell.

The family will receive friends on Saturday, June 15 from 2:00-4:00 PM at Cavin-Cook Funeral Home with a graveside service following at Glenwood Memorial Park, Mooresville.

“ I had the unique opportunity to experience the events of September 11th while sitting in Mr. Campbell's US History class. Like many it was a defining moment for me and my path to adulthood.
