“ I met Dave over 50 years ago when he returned home to Michigan and took a job with Ford in Light Truck Engineering. He was one of many engineers who left working on rockets and jet planes in sunny California to work on what was at the time pretty simple pickup trucks, vans and ORVs (off road vehicles) at Ford. Dave, of course, had the “secret handshake” of a University of Michigan engineer and I’m sure that impressed his new boss, Roger Simpson. Back then, there were no cubicles – just a giant room full of desks and shared telephones under a cloud of cigar and cigarette smoke. Dave was part of a tight knit team who wrestled pickup sales leadership from Chevrolet and started the 47-year win streak for the F150.

Since we both worked in the same group and, since he lived nearby and it was the height of the 1972 gas crisis, we carpooled together. Dave would proudly talk about the exploits and accomplishments of his 2 sons and daughter as we made our 20-mile trip to Dearborn each day. This daily commute was abruptly interrupted when Dave was laid off in Nov, 1974. He was called back a few months later and we returned to our rides together.

Dave was a private pilot and had a share in a small plane based at the Oakland County airport. We both daydreamed of visiting the Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio and he would carefully plan a day trip down to Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio only to have to repeatedly cancel due to weather or plane troubles. We were able to take a few short local flights where I took some great photos of our home from the air.

Dave and I took different jobs and assignments at Ford and our day-to-day contact came to an end. Later, our friendship was renewed when his daughter Tracy moved into our neighborhood in Farmington Hills and I met his wife Marie.

Dave was an excellent engineer, a true friend, caring father, loving husband, and a wonderful human being. Rest in Peace friend.

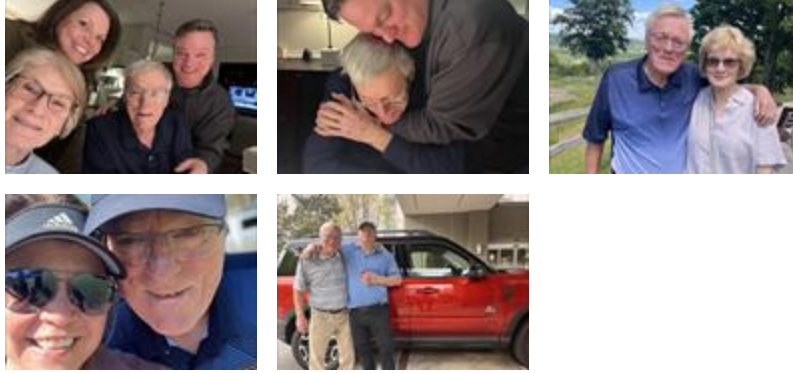
