Rufus Donald Kistler, 81, of Mooresville, passed away on Monday, May 12, 2014 at Lake Norman Regional Medical Center.

He was born on August 24, 1932 in Mooresville, to the late Rufus Edgar and Lomaner Hayer Kistler. He was a US Navy veteran serving during the Korean War on the USS Midway. Mr. Kistler was retired from Davidson College in the athletic maintenance department. He was a member of Coddle Creek ARP Church in Mooresville, where he taught Sunday School and was an elder for over 40 years. He was very active in the church. Donald loved to garden and share the vegetables with family and friends and also loved spending time with his family.
