Duane Theodore Carter, 87, passed away on Thursday, March 17, 2022. He was born to the late Carl "Jack" and Velma Carter on December 18, 1934, in Mocksville, NC. He grew up there and in Mooresville, NC, where he graduated from Mooresville High School in 1953. After graduation, he attended Gardner-Webb College and NC State University before going to work as a Measurement Engineer for Transcontinental Pipeline Corporation.
