Earlene Wandrey - Whitaker, 78, of Mooresville, NC, passed away at 9:50 p.m. Saturday, April 9th, 2016, at the Gordon Hospice House in Statesville, NC. She fought a valiant 11-year battle against cancer and participated in numerous medical studies and fundraising efforts to support cancer research. Earlene was born on Feb. 3, 1938, in Leland, Miss., the 9th child of 15 by Albert and Marie (Frazier) Carter. She was a successful business woman running a small chain of shoe stores in Central Ohio, before moving on to own a ladies consignment boutique in Westerville, OH. Before her passing, Earlene published her memoirs, "Walk in My Shoes." She loved traveling, gardening, and socializing with family and friends.
