Ernest "Ernie" Cone Crymes Jr., 80, of Mooresville, passed away Monday, June 3, 2024 at Novant Health Presbyterian Medical Center in Charlotte.

Ernie was born July 16, 1943 in Decatur, GA to the late Ernest Cone Crymes and Mary Elmina McKnight Crymes. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his first wife, Diane White Crymes, and son, Whitney C. Crymes.
