I didn't get to sit and have very many conversations with her while I worked at Terra Bella, because while i was there, she was in the area that didn't need assistance. She amazed me with how much sewing things she had in her apartment. I knew if I ever needed advice on how to fix something or make something, she was definitely one of the women I could go to.

I think my favorite memory of her was when it was time to move her to a new apartment (the first time) and she looked dead at my nurse and told him that she would stay in that place until the day she died. At the time, it was so funny.

Another memory was when she had misplaced the money she had in her apartment and thought someone had come in and taken it.

When myself and another care giver went in to help her search for it, we found it for her. She was so excited that we found it. I don't remember how we talked her into letting us call her granddaughter but we called and gave her that money for safe keeping.

I know whenever she felt something was wrong, and I would pass her in the hallway, she would ALWAYS stop me to explain what was wrong and what happened. I don't know if its because she remembered me or if she knew I wouldn't make her feel like as if she was going crazy, as she would tell me.

She definitely had her people that she didn't care for and she would let you know, too.

Joy will for sure be missed by so many people. My heart goes out to her family so much.
