



Frank Powell Knox

May 29, 1943 - December 9, 2024

It is with profound sadness that we announce the passing of Frank Powell Knox, age 81, of Mooresville, who left this world on Monday, December 9, 2024, at the S. Mitchell Mack Hospice House. Born on May 29, 1943, in Iredell County, NC, Frank was the beloved son of Graham Watts Knox and Mary Elizabeth Purser Knox.

A career which started in clothing sales eventually led him to belt design, manufacturing and sales. But it was his service to his community that truly defined him. A lifelong member of Fair View United Methodist Church, he was referred to lovingly as the "Mayor of Mt. Mourne" for his warm presence and commitment to others. A proud member of the National Guard, Frank embodied the spirit of service in everything he did.

Known for his generous heart, he found joy in visiting those in hospice, hospitals, nursing homes and especially attending funerals, offering comfort and companionship to those in need. He had a passion for the outdoors and a love for 4H. Frank's support for local organizations, including Crossnore Communities for Children and the Hope of Mooresville (HOME), revealed his deep commitment to bettering the lives of those around him, particularly children. 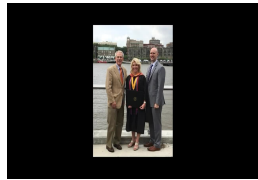
