Harriet Lamar Avery, 79, of Mooresville, North Carolina, passed away peacefully on July 15, 2025.

Lamar was born in Atlanta, Georgia, to Willene Capers Kitchens and Harrison Lamar Avery. A lifelong educator and mentor, she spent the majority of her career as a beloved teacher at Brawley Middle School, where she retired after many years of service. Known for her warmth, wit, and fierce dedication to her students, Lamar shaped the lives of countless children and families. She was once honored as Teacher of the Year which is just one of many testaments to the lasting impact she made in the classroom.
