Jack Edgar Moore, 93, of Mooresville, passed away on Friday, April 11, 2025, at his home surrounded by his loving family.

He was born on December 20, 1931, in Mooresville, NC, to the late Flate and Hattie Griffin Moore. Jack was a 1952 graduate of Mooresville High School. He was a veteran serving in the US Navy.
