Jim loved old cars, was an excellent southern cook and host entertaining often, loved a good prank and enjoyed big band era and classical music. He played the organ, enjoyed a good pipe and helped and mentored friends and neighbors throughout his life. Jim was also a proud dad as he helped both sons achieve their dream of becoming airline pilots. He

spent many hours with his family northern fishing, boating and camping on the St. Croix River. He kept boats and snowmobiles running. He walked everyday greeting friends after he retired to Peachtree City, GA, and then The Pines at Davidson, NC. Jim is survived by two sons, Mike and wife, Kathy, and their children, Alex, Amelia and Olivia, of Hudson, WI, and Burt and wife, Kathy, and their children, Blake and Joel, of Mooresville, NC. Even in his later years with his sight gone, he kept up with longtime friends across the US, listened to his music-a huge collection of CDs, Davidson's WDAV, Pastor Charles Stanley, and up on the stock market and latest news.
