August 17, 1988 - August 23, 2025

Jason John Doyle, 37, of Mooresville, NC, passed away on Saturday, August 23, 2025. He was born on August 17, 1988, in Hendersonville, NC, to David Doyle and Jodi Doyle.

Jason lived a life filled with purpose, joy, and a smile that could light up any room. He spent his childhood in Hendersonville, where he was happiest playing sports or spending time outdoors with his brother, Clayton, and his family. In 1997, the Doyle family moved to Mooresville, where Jason continued building deep friendships and lasting memories.

In 2015, Jason faced a life-changing injury that left him a paraplegic - but it never defined or diminished him. Through countless surgeries and ongoing pain, Jason remained full of life, humor, and heart. His resilience was as infectious as his smile. He had a unique ability to find laughter even in life's toughest moments and lifted the spirits of everyone around him.

Over time, Jason transformed from a patient into a mentor, and then into a passionate advocate. He found purpose working with a nonprofit organization, raising awareness and funds for causes close to his heart. His work touched countless lives, inspiring others through both his words and actions.

Jason never let his injury limit his life. He embraced adaptive sports like hand

cycling and water skiing and even fulfilled a dream of driving a NASCAR racecar around Dover Downs Speedway. No matter the challenge, Jason lived boldly, joyfully, and fully.

He was preceded in death by his Grandfather Johnny Doyle and his beloved service dog Colt. He is survived by his parents, David Doyle and Jodi Doyle, brother Clayton Doyle, grandmother Barbara Doyle, sister-in-law Stephanie Menzo Doyle, and his twin nephews Ryder Doyle and Cash Doyle, extended family, and a wide circle of friends who will carry his legacy of love, laughter, and perseverance.

“ I will always remember my cousin Jason as someone who would light up a room and bring laughter to any conversation and that did not change after his accident. One of my earliest memories of our childhood was his favorite color...purple. As a kid the choice of purple stood out to me. That was a bit of foreshadowing for his personality and character. Jason stood out, his character and personality stayed with you. He was the life of the party, easy to talk to and could get you laughing pretty quickly. He always had a great story to tell or an old memory of the cousins that would bring us all laughter.

Never having a brother, my cousins are like brothers to me. I spent many summers with Clayton and Jason. We had a lot in common and always had a great time together. Our Grandmother would often watch us while our dads were working and take us on errands to the bank. Our favorite thing to do was to wait until she got out of the car then crank the volume of her radio so that when she got back in the car and turned it on it would startle her. As we got older I noticed how competitive Jason was. It really came out with his brother Clayton, no matter if it was big wheel racing, bikes, go karts, or racing video games, he wasn't going to give up until he figured out how to beat him. I enjoyed watching their arguments and competitions. It was great entertainment.

Jason liked food. He liked to cook and my first memory of that was when I moved to Mooresville, I lived with my aunt, uncle, Clayton, and Jason. Jason was probably 14 or 15 at the time and he always helped with the meals. If we were having Kraft Macaroni and Cheese with our meal Jason made it. If you didn't know (Jason taught me) there is an art to making the best tasting Kraft Macaroni and Cheese and Jason had mastered it. Even at recent family get togethers, Jason was often by the grill, playfully correcting his dad on how he was undercooking or overcooking the meat.

Jason was a hard worker from a young age. Dinner is where families connect and it was that way in Jason's home. The only

*dinner conversations I can remember while I lived there were Jason telling his dad about Clayton not doing chores like picking up dog poop, taking out the trash and sweeping the garage. Jason would always call out Clayton for not doing his chores and tell Clayton, "but don't worry Clayton I got it for you."*

*Jason was an early riser. He woke up early all the time! He seemed to always have something to do or somewhere to be. He always had a ton of initiative and loved to work. He seemed ready to get out of the house as soon as he could. I wasn't surprised when he quickly rose to managing a landscape crew that serviced high end homes around the lake. He was smart, innovative and knew how to hustle.*

*Jason was a champion, he did not let his accident define him. He battled lengthy pain and suffering years after his accident. It seemed like one complication after the other. But through it all he stayed strong and positive. It should be no surprise because that's who Jason was, he found the positive in every situation. Even through his trials he used his experience and found the energy to help motivate others. I will miss my cousin's contagious smile, easy going spirit, and great conversations but I will always cherish the moments of life we shared.*
