John "Gus" Thomas Gustafson, 78, of Mooresville, North Carolina passed away peacefully, May 26th in his home.

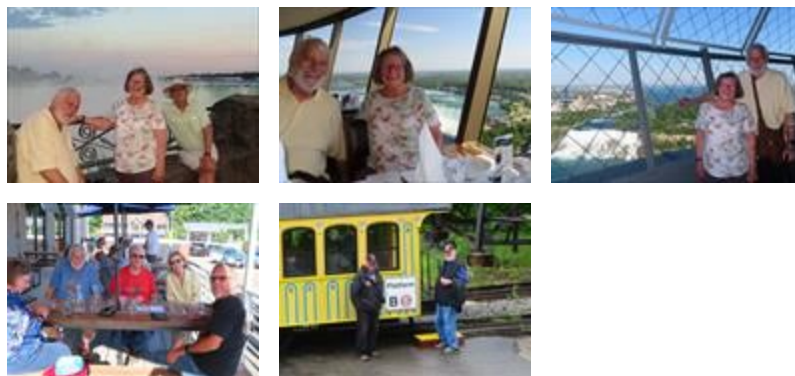
