John William "Bill" Marshall passed away peaceful at Lake Norman Regional on August 12, 2021. He was 85 years young. Born in Ohio, he was the son of the late John Paul Marshall and Nola Mione Shaw. Growing up as a child, he loved to shoot the rifle, go hunting and working with model planes. As he grew older, he got into scuba diving, sky diving and boating. He enjoyed watching westerns. Bill joined the military in 1954. He proudly served his country during the Vietnam War aboard the USS Midway. He started out as a Parachute Rigger and eventually retired as a Chief in 1984.
