September 10, 1930 - November 1, 2016

Joseph Augenstine Nolan, 86, of Mooresville, passed away on Tuesday, November 1, 2016. He was born on September 10, 1930 in Philadelphia, PA, to the late John Joseph and Margaret McGrenra Nolan. Prior to retirement, he taught Latin and English for 39 years at The Wardlaw-Hartridge School and Bishop Ahr (formerly St. Thomas Aquinas) High School in Edison, New Jersey. Mr. Nolan was a devout member of St. Therese Catholic Church where he was a Eucharistic Minister. He was an avid sports fan and coached basketball, football and golf. He was a loving husband, father and grandfather. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother, Dr. John Phillip Nolan. 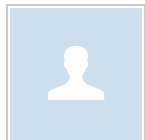
