I am so grateful to have the honor of having her a part of the majority of my life even though we had a few years that were rough she was always there to help me get through like when my parents died, I was not so sure I could deal with the loss, I told her when my mom died 6 years ago I said so this is what it feels like to be an orphan she actually yelled at me & said no Laurie you are not & will not ever be an orphan I'm still here & when its my time to go you still won't be an orphan you still have a Father in heaven who created all of us & he will never leave you. I was so wowed by what she said it was & is so very true. Now she has left all of us but what we need to remember is that she loved each of us & what she said about our father who created all of us & no that as long as each of us gives our lives to God, we will see her & many others who has left us

before her. Mom left each one of us a piece of her in some way or another just remember ALL the memories the good & bad because she helped to mold each of us rather it would be a lesson or just a good laugh or even a good cry. We will always carry her in our hearts because of the love she gave us the words of lessons or advice she gave our ears to hear & the stories she would tell as long as we remember these things, she will never die only her body is gone but its up to all of us to keep her alive in spirit. Robbie, Sammy, & Joseph, I promise you Mom loved all 3 of you & would not want any of us to be saddened by her leaving this world her work here on earth was done she did her job & completed her assignment now its up to all of us whose lives she touched to complete our assignments so we can all join her & all of our loved ones in heaven. May God be with all 3 of you & the rest of the family Mom will be missed for sure but one thing I know ALL of us can agree on We all loved her so much.
