Katherine "Katie" Elizabeth Brooks, 37, of Mooresville, went to be with her Heavenly Father on Friday, October 31, 2014. Born November 18, 1976, in Charlotte, she was a daughter of Robert and Susan Williams Brooks, of Sherrills Ford. Katie was a graduate of UNC Chapel Hill and Presbyterian College School of Nursing, now Queens University. She was a traveling nurse whom specialized in the treatment of children. Katie was loved by her patients, some of whom kept in contact with her over the years. She was a member of Rehobeth United Methodist Church, Terrell. Katie was preceded in death by her maternal grandparents, Alice Smith Williams and E. Crawley Williams, Jr. and paternal grandparents, Dorice Brooks and Ella Lee Honeycutt Brooks. In addition to her parents, she is survived by her sisters, Stephanie Lynn Brooks and Kelli Suzanne Brooks; nephew, Caleb Netterville; and aunts and uncles, Allie and George Mauney, Eddie Williams, John Williams, Gay and Kevin Mertz. “ I am absolutely heartbroken to hear this news. Katie was the primary nurse on duty in the NICU the evening that Ellie was born at Presbyterian - Huntersville (September 13, 2008). Katie was the most amazingly kind, thoughtful, and helpful people I encountered during the 22 days Ellie was in the NICU, but all the while, she was real (she said it like it was and always gave me the truth - I SO appreciated that!). She invited me to come give Ellie her first bath (around midnight that night), and she showed me how to not be scared to handle my tiny kiddo ("she won't break, I promise!"). Katie was a constant, and she always made sure that she had Ellie in her charge because she was "her favorite." She also was the one who dressed Ellie (in the same outfit I wore home from the hospital when I was a baby, so tiny E was swimming in it!) when I could finally take her home. The nurses in the NICU were literally my lifeline... I was (and still am!) a single mother as my daughter's father chose not to be involved in her life. The premature birth was 100% unexpected as I was not at risk at any time during my pregnancy; I had not even considered what to do or think if my baby was born early. I was so unprepared, worried, and even scared. Katie was right there for me the entire time, and it meant the world to have such an amazing, experienced woman in my court. She is the first nurse I think of whenever there is an opportunity to say thank you, and I always tag her on Ellie's birthday pictures because she was such a big part of the actual day E was born. I got to know her during our 3+ week stay in the NICU, and I know she was a devoted aunt and a wonderful, giving person. I am in shock that she has passed away... I wish her family peace and also pride in the knowledge that Katie made such a huge difference in many lives, including mine and my precious daughter's. I have attached a photo of her getting my Ellie ready to finally go home. Katie was truly an angel to me & my baby girl on earth and is no doubt busy as one for so many already in heaven.
