Kathryn "Kay" Kipka Jones, 86, of Mooresville, passed away on Monday, February 26, 2018 at Carillon Assisted Living in Lincolnton.

She was born on February 2, 1932 in Philippines, to the late Claude White Kipka and Julia Meacham Kipka. Mrs. Jones was a graduate of UNC Greensboro and Old Dominion University. She was a retired medical technologist. Mrs. Jones was a member of Central United Methodist Church in Mooresville, where she was a member of the church choir. She was also a member of the United Daughters of the Confederacy Battle of Bentonville Chapter 818 and of the Mooresville Lion's Club. Mrs. Jones loved serving with children, where she helped with the children's choir in the 60's and was a Girl Scout leader in the 70's.
