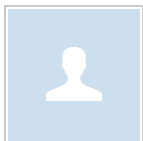

Thank goodness no one else could hear us but it sure was fun. All of our lives will permanently change without Kelly. All of the holidays will be less fun without him here with us. But all of us that love the Lord as our Savior will see him again. He is now very happy with his Mom, Ma Maw Mildred, and all those that have gone on before us.
