Mooreville - Larry Reid Morgan passed away on April 23rd at Duke Health Lake Norman Hospital.

Reid was born September 13, 1933 in Rowan County. The fourth child of the late Lee Roy and Mable Katherine Karriker Morgan. He served his country in the Army and was deployed to Korea and later sent to Japan. He was a graduate of China Grove High School and Salisbury Business College. Reid worked at Presbyterian Hospital. He retired from his job as business office manager after 27 years and then worked two more years before fully retiring from Alexander Community Hospital. He had a gift for being able to fix anything.

He was creative and inventive, making life easier for those in need. Those qualities earned him the title of "Mr. Fix It".

He was a loving husband, father, son, brother, uncle, grandfather, and great grandfather. He was preceded in death by his parents, brother Jack, sisters Doris Sims and Louise St. Clair, son Stephen Reid Sr., grandson Stephen Reid, Jr., and great granddaughter MacKenzie Morgan.

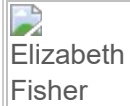
