Margaret Shue Shoe, 67, of Mooresville, passed away on Saturday, August 23, 2014.

She was born on May 6, 1947 in Concord, NC, to the late Paul Alexander and Nell Lipe Shue. Mrs. Shoe was a 1965 graduate of South Rowan High School and 1969 graduate of Appalachian State University, where she received her Bachelor of Science degree in Education. She was a retired AP US History teacher for Mooresville High School, where she was honored with Teacher of the Year.

She is survived by her husband of 45 years, Steven L. Shoe; daughters, Stephanie Glasco and husband, Brian of Estero, FL, Elizabeth Rivera and husband, David of Brooklyn, NY; and sister, Eugenia Waring and husband, Frank of Landis, NC.

Funeral services will be held at 2:00 PM on Tuesday, August 26 at St. Mark's Lutheran Church with Rev. Johnny C. Cozart officiating. Burial will follow the service at West Lawn Cemetery in China Grove. The family will

receive friends on Monday from 6:30-8:30 PM at Cavin-Cook Funeral Home.
