Matthew "Matt" Burge Auten, 45, of Swannanoa, NC, passed away on Tuesday, August 19, 2014.

Born July 23, 1969, in Mooresville, he is the son of Eugene Craven Auten and Margaret Burge Auten. Matt was a graduate of North Hills Christian in Salisbury and a 1991 graduate of Montreat College. He was Facilities Manager for Western NC Group Homes. Matt attended Christ Community Church in Montreat. He was a beloved husband and father, a kind friend, and known for his gift of singing and songwriting.

In addition to his parents, Matt is survived by his wife, Amy Lutfy Auten, whom he married January 1, 1994; children, Graham (age 9) and Benjamin Auten (age 7); brother, Mark Auten and wife, Ellen; sister, Anne A. Baker and husband, Chuck, and numerous nieces and nephews whom he loved dearly.

A memorial service will be held at 2 PM, Saturday, August 23, 2014, at First Presbyterian Church, Mooresville, with Rev. David Rockness officiating. The family will receive friends immediately following the service in the church
