Matthew John Wisneski, 36, of Mooresville, formally of Glenford, NY, passed away on Wednesday, June 4, 2014 at the Lake Norman Regional Medical Center in Mooresville after a brief illness.

Matthew lived in Glenford most of his life. He graduated from Onteora Central School and was a Boy Scout in troop 63 in Shokan where he achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. He joined the West Hurley Fire Department in 1993 serving as the company secretary of the Glenford Engine Company. After graduating from Ulster Country Community College Matt went to work for Lowes Home Improvement when they opened in Kingston in 1997. He continued to work for Lowes when he moved to North Carolina at a store near Charlotte in 2008.

Matts enthusiasm and spark caught the attention of many which turn earned him many close and dear friends. His introduction to NASCAR by his Uncle Jay in the early 80â€™s got him hooked and he continued to be their biggest fan until the last day he was with us. From his involvement in go cart racing with his friend Larry to his trips to Pocono Raceway with his racing buddies,

Matt's™ passion for auto racing inspired him to relocate to North Carolina to be in the center of the sport. While living in both New York and North Carolina he was able to meet many drivers, owners and team members. He was appointed to the Fan Council of the Charlotte Motor Speedway.

When you first met Matt you noticed the wheelchair but quickly forgot it was there after getting to know him. His positive attitude and "can do spirit" helped him overcome many physical challenges. He was a true person of value and had something to share and teach by example to everyone he met. He lived by the saying on a card he carried with him "When the going gets tough, the tough get going."

Matt is survived by his parents Joe and Janet Wisneski of Glenford; a sister, Jessica and her husband, Brett Fox of Olivebridge, NY; and his nephews, Henry and Billy. He also leaves behind Aunts, Uncles, and many dear and close friends.
