Melton "Dink" Douglas Moss, 77, of Charlotte, passed away on Friday, May 29, 2015 at Carolinas Medical Center-Pineville.

Dink was born on July 17, 1937 to Albert and Mable Riley Moss of Stanley, NC. He was born in Charlotte but spent his youth in Stanley, where he attended both grammar and high school. Dink was very athletic in High School and played both baseball and football. Dink attended King's College in Charlotte and served in the US Air Force National Guard. He was always an outside salesman working with Ingersoll Rand in Davidson and McNaughton-McKay Electric Company and several others in Charlotte. Prior to returning to Charlotte, Dink lived in Knoxville, TN where he was an active member of the Jaycees, winning numerous awards and serving as President. Dink was a member of the West Gate Masonic Lodge #738 AF&AM, a 32 Degree Scottish Rite Mason Valley of Charlotte, Life Member of Oasis Shriners, Oasis Patrol, Royal Order of Jesters Court 109, all in Charlotte.
