Mrs. Norah Kathleen Barron Dahlen, 90, of Mooresville, NC, died peacefully with family and friends at her side on April 30, 2022, at the S. Mitchell Mack Hospice House. Norah was born August 14, 1931, in Minneapolis, Minnesota to the late J. Howard and Alma Charlton Barron. Mrs. Dahlen was a graduate of Holy Angels Academy in Richfield, MN and attended the University of Minnesota. She was married to the late M. Boyne Dahlen for over 50 years until his passing in 2002.
