Peter DiPrima passed away peacefully at Gordon Hospice in Statesville, North Carolina on September 9 at the age of 92. He was born in Brooklyn, New York on New Year's Eve in 1932 to the late Damiano and Guiseppina DiPrima. Peter was predeceased by his sister Ann and daughter-in-law Kim.

He is survived by his loving wife of 66 years, Kathleen of Mooresville, North Carolina; 3 children, Stephen and his wife Tammy of Hastings, Michigan; daughter Marie of Mooresville, North Carolina and son Peter and his wife Linda of Carolina Beach, North Carolina. A hard worker, Pete loved to tell stories about working at a very young age, delivering newspapers and working for a local butcher. After the Navy Pete held a variety of jobs while going to night school. He joined General Foods in 1959, working in

finance until he retired in 1989.

Pete loved raising his family in Pleasantville. An active member of the community, he coached Dad's Club sports and served as a volunteer fireman for over 40 years. Pete was a life-long Yankees fan and enjoyed sports of all kinds. An avid tennis player into his mid-eighties, he also enjoyed playing softball and golf and was an excellent bowler. Every summer for over a decade he also looked forward to spending a week at The Big Grouper in Carolina Beach with his children and grandchildren.

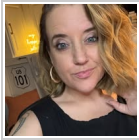
