Raymond Engleman, 83, of Mooresville, died after a long and courageous fight with cancer. He was a dedicated family man who also was a sports enthusiast. He loved golfing, fishing, boating, horses, Indiana University basketball, the Chicago Cubs, NFL football, tennis, and many other sports. He was a member of Williamson's Chapel United Methodist Church in Mooresville. Ray was a long time Lion's Club member, including serving as the District Governor of District 31 B. Ray retired in 1988 from Alliance Foods, Inc., after serving 7 years as the Executive Vice President. Prior to that, he was a sales manager for Alliance for 4 years. Other career milestones included working for Federated Foods for 11 years, Central Grocers Cooperative for 5 years, and the Calumet Press for 2.5 years. He served in the U.S. Army as Company Commander and Personnel Officer, 93rd Signal Bn., Fort Huachuca, Arizona. He was then promoted to 1st Lieutenant prior to release from reserve duty. Ray was predeceased by his wife Donna of 58 years. He is survived by his sister Shirley Lynch, his 3 children Randy (Gayle) Engleman, Connie (Mack) Johnson, and Scott (Margret) Engleman; grandchildren Aaron (Jennifer), Ryan (Katya), Taylor, Tyler, Kyle, Tim (Alicia), Kevin (Katie DeRoos), Michelle, Derek, Katelyn, JAC, and Sam; great-grandchildren Elise, Luke, Anna, Alina, and Alena.
