Robert Neal “Bud” Weiser, 84, of Mooresville passed away on Monday, October 19, 2020. Bud was born on October 6, 1936 in Mexico, Missouri, to the late Oliver and Florence Whitman Weiser. He was a loving husband, father, and grandfather, and he will be greatly missed by everyone who knew him.

From a young age, Bud exhibited a love for life that was unmatched.
