Roger Raymond Snapp, 68, of Mocksville, NC, went to his Heavenly home on Saturday, November 22, 2014 at the Kate B. Reynolds Hospice Home in Winston-Salem, NC.

He was born on March 6, 1946 in Meadowview, VA, to the late Marvin and Stella Snapp. He served his country honorably in the US Army via the 1st Air Cavalry, 11th Aviation Battalion 1966-1968 and was a Vietnam War veteran. Roger was an avid baseball fan with his loyalty to the Atlanta Braves. College basketball was his vice in the winter, cheering for the Duke Blue Devils. As a hands-on dad he coached his son, Chris's little league baseball and Optimist Soccer teams. Roger spent 30 years working for the Schlitz/Stroh Brewery, retiring in 1999. He was an active member of Wesley Memorial United Methodist Church and provided leadership to the Board of Trustees, Methodist Men's Club and the Men's softball team. Upon his retirement he gave countless volunteer hours to Samaritan Ministries, Senior Services and helped build several homes for Habitat for Humanity.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a brother, Robert

Snapp; and his sister, Betty Snapp.

Roger is survived by his wife of 46 years, Elaine Isenhour Snapp of the home; and his son, Chris of Clemmons. Roger was loved by many and will be greatly missed.
