Rose Kelly LePage, of Mooresville, passed away on Sunday, October 4, 2015. She was born on December 23, 1943 in Hartford, Connecticut, to the late Hilda Winkler Kelly McTierran and Authur Kelly. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her loving husband, Louis LePage, Sr. of 50 years; her oldest son, Louis Donat LePage, Jr, who passed in 1982. Rose was a graduate of Moylan-Wilson School and a graduate of Hartford Public High School class of 1962. She was a stay at home mom until she worked as a waitress part time and later was employed at Crystal Home Cleaner.
