He taught himself how to rebuild computers and support software systems, becoming a certified IT Consultant. Tommy was a very intelligent man and had a great memory. He also enjoyed cooking and his best dishes were lasagna and homemade meatballs. He knew his stuff, that's for sure, and never backed down from a challenge. One of his famous quotes was "I'm a survivor and I can't let the b@\$tards win!"

Tommy was so happy that he had found the love of his life, Lisa, in his later years as well. He loved and cherished her deeply, even spoiled her a little and always told her how beautiful she was, and she was the best thing that ever happened to him. He called her his "Loving Angel" and their favorite songs were "Angel", "Wedding Day" and "The Well" by Casting Crowns, which was the first concert they went to together and it was amazing! He was also blessed to share and enjoy her beautiful family, when his was so far away. He was so thankful for his salvation when he asked Jesus to come into his heart, forgive him of his sins and save his soul.
