Troy DeWitt Mullis, Jr., 73, of Mooresville, NC, passed away on Saturday, September 27, 2014.

He was born on June 5, 1941 in Aberdeen, NC, to the late Troy and Mary Brodgen Mullis. Mr. Mullis received his Bachelor of Science degree from Davis Elkins College and his Master's degree from Radford University. He was a probation officer in Fincastle, VA for 10 years, served as chief psychologist at Jackson Training School in Concord, NC for 12 years, and later retired from Rowan Cabarrus Community College as an instructor after teaching for 16 years. Mr. Mullis was a member of Lake Norman Evangelical Presbyterian Church, where he was a fellowship group leader. He was a Bible scholar, loved to cook and grocery shop daily.

He is survived by his wife of 36 years, Betty Sorrell Mullis; daughters, Lucy Kitner and husband, Oliver of York, PA, Ellen Mundy and Cammie Mundy of Mooresville; sister, Mary Elizabeth Capillary and husband, Anthony; brother, Herman Thomas Mullis and wife, Diane; grandchildren, Elizabeth Kitner, Lindsey Mundy, Jacob Martin, Jayson Martin; and numerous nieces, nephews,
