Walter Harry Fosbenner, age 91, passed away peacefully at home on December 28, 2025. He lived a long and meaningful life, born on February 27, 1934, in King of Prussia, PA. Walt developed a strong work ethic at an early age while helping his father at their family-owned service station. Those early years taught him the value of hard work and taking pride in a job done right - principles that guided him throughout his life.

He served in the United States Navy, stationed at the Brunswick, Maine Naval Air Station (NAS Brunswick). Following his service, he continued his working life with the same consistency and dependability he had learned as a young boy. He became a private pilot and flying instructor and even lived and worked in Belize for some time. After returning to Pennsylvania, Walt built his own modular construction business that he ran for many years in the Philadelphia PA/NJ area. He later retired in 1999 in Mooresville, North Carolina.

Throughout his life, Walt found joy in life's simple pleasures - meaningful conversations, the mechanics of a car, planes, travel and sweets. He leaves behind many memories shared with loved ones.
