Warren Page Havens of Sugar Hill, New Hampshire passed away in Mooresville, North Carolina on March 24, 2024 at the age of 91.

Born April 4, 1932 in Norwich, Connecticut, the son of the late Earl Bonner Havens, Sr. and Dorothy Gertrude (Page) Havens, Warren grew up in Rhode Island, graduated from West Warwick Senior High School and the University of Maryland. Warren enjoyed performing magic and was a member of the "Rhode Island Society of Magicians". A decorated Korean War Veteran, Warren's career with the Central Intelligence Agency took him to many countries throughout the world, including living in England, Taiwan, Cyprus and Greece.

Warren is survived by his wife of 69 years Marilyn Ruby (Wolfenden); his children, Kevin Havens (Diane), Robin Gauvreau (Larry) and Keith Havens; grandchildren, Trevor Havens (Amy), Benjamin Gauvreau (Jessica), Brian Havens (Samantha), Nicholas Gauvreau, Jessica Collins (Josh), Gretchen Smith (PJ), Tanner Havens (Hannah); and great-grandchildren, Taylor Havens, Hannah Havens, Grayson Collins, Dax Collins, Grace Havens, Grady Gauvreau, and Ruby Gauvreau.

Warren was a lifelong athlete and outdoorsman. In retirement, he played shortstop for the Littleton Senior Softball Team, and continued hiking the

major peaks of New Hampshire's White Mountains, a member of the AMC's 4000-footers club, having climbed the 48 peaks over 4000 feet. Warren loved moose, black bears, and hummingbirds, especially those who shared the woods of his home in Sugar Hill.

A "Celebration of Life" will be held at the First United Methodist Church of Littleton, New Hampshire at a later date, with interment in Rhode Island.
