William Homer Overcash, 93, of Mooresville, passed away on Sunday, August 10, 2014 at the VA Medical Center in Salisbury.

He was born on August 4, 1921 in Barringer, TN, to the late Fred E. and Beulah Sloop Overcash. Mr. Overcash was a US Army veteran, where he received the Asiatic Pacific Theater Campaign Medal with one bronze star, Good Conduct Medal, and the Philippine Liberation Ribbon with one bronze service star and Purple Heart. He was retired from Burlington Industries, was a farmer for all his life and came from a family of 12 brothers and sisters.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Effie Mae Chester Overcash.
